

Six 21 Financial Support: Key Information

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is available to students who need financial assistance with the costs of staying in education. Below are the bursaries and financial support that are available to apply for.

Provision of these bursaries is dependent on punctuality and attendance (including virtual activities if necessary). Details of these are listed below.

Full Bursary

A bursary of up to £1,200 a year is available for young people who are included in one of the defined groups listed below (this is referred to in official documentation as the vulnerable bursary). This is determined nationally and not by individual sixth forms. You are eligible for this if you are:

- In care
- Care leaver
- Are receiving one of the following in your own right:
 - Income Support or Universal Credit
 - Employment Support Allowance
 - Disability Living Allowance
 - Personal Independence Payments

Six 21 Bursary

The Six 21 Bursary is available to students who do not qualify for the full bursary but do need financial support in order to continue their further education.

How to apply

All students wishing to be considered for a bursary will be required to complete an application form with required evidence attached. This will be sent to all enrolled students next week.

Conditions

In order to receive your bursary, you need to ensure that you meet the following additional criteria:

- You need to have your own bank account.
- Your attendance is not to drop below 100%, excluding authorised absences.
- Your punctuality not to drop below 97%.

One-off Bursary Payments

A small amount of money is also available for one-off expenses throughout the year, for example for exceptional travel costs associated with work placements.
